#### **Clean Ohio Assistance Fund Updates**

Effective immediately, the COAF program for cleanup applications is suspended. Projects which have already completed a Project Resource and Advisory Meeting (PRAM) and those already under review exceed the allocation of funds available for cleanup for FY 2011. All projects which have conducted a PRAM may submit their applications for consideration.

Phase II assessment grant dollars continue to be available and applications may be submitted at anytime http://clean.ohio.gov/ BrownfieldRevitalization/AssistanceFundApplication.htm A new Priority Investment Areas Map is available online: http://clean.ohio.gov/ BrownfieldRevitalization/BrownfieldRevitalizationMaps.htm The Ohio Priority Investment Areas map identifies the counties and municipalities that are eligible for the COAF program.

#### **Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund Updates**

A newly updated Disbursement Manual is available online. One particular revision of note, grant funds will no longer be disbursed without proof of payment for previous draws (i.e. proof of payment to contractors from Draw 1 must be included with Draw 2 information). CORF Round 9 is scheduled to begin on July 21, 2010. Applications are anticipated from 12 of the 19 Ohio Public Works Districts. Round 9 has \$22.9M available for eligible projects.

#### Funding for Assessment and Remediation to Address Petroleum Releases from Underground Storage Tanks

The Bureau of Underground Storage Tank Regulations (BUSTR) announce a funding opportunity they have available. As part of ARRA, BUSTR is offering funding for assessment and remediation to address petroleum releases from underground storage tanks in all eight regions of the State.

Applicable sites for the ARRA program must have been contaminated due to a release of petroleum from an underground storage tank. In addition, BUSTR must have established that viable responsible parties no longer exist to perform the regulatory required investigation and clean up of the contamination.
